## GENERAL INFO.

Located in the lower region of Northeastern Thailand, 629 kilometers from Bangkok, Ubon Ratchathani province features plateaus and mountain ranges with the Mun River running through the middle. Sandstone cliffs along the Mekong River serve as a natural border between Thailand and Laos. This region, where Ubon Ratchathani borders both Cambodia and Laos and the Mekong flows into Cambodia has been coined “the Emerald Triangle” in recognition of its magnificent green landscapes. Adding to Ubon Ratchathani’s natural appeal, Phu Chong Nayoi and Pha Taem National Parks are two of Isan’s most unspoiled and unvisited natural preserves. Ubon Ratchathani is also a wonderful place to witness the annual candle festival, a charming Buddhist celebration.

## HOW TO GO

### By BUS:

### BY AIR:

**Nok Air, Thai AirAsia and Thai Lion Air** have daily flights connecting from Don Muang Airport Bangkok to Ubon Ratchathani Airport while **Thai Smile** has daily flights connecting from Suvarnabhumi Airport Bangkok to Ubon Ratchathani Airport.
